

1. Introduction to Residential Survey for Jews with Disabilities

The function or purpose of this survey is to determine commonality of need among Jews with disabilities for residential services, to identify specific programming needs (ie.e kashrut, Shomer Shabbat, etc), and to look for groupings of people by disability or need.

The Jewish Residential Task Force of the Minneapolis Jewish Community Inclusion Program for People with Disabilities, a program of Jewish Family and Children's Service of Minneapolis and the Minneapolis Jewish Federation, is examining the residential needs of Jews with disabilities. The survey is for exploratory research purposes only, and is not a commitment on your part should residential services become available. 


